



## Overnight Guidelines

### What does my dog need to bring for their overnight at TailWaggers Doggy Daycare?

- 1) Adequate food provided in one of two ways:
  - a) In a sealed container marked with your dog's name and the amount of food given at each feeding, or
  - b) Pre-measured for each feeding, packaged in individual containers or plastic re-sealable bags.
- 2) A blanket, small bed or towel is welcome but not necessary (it must be of a size that can easily fit in a washer and dryer).
- 3) All medication must be labeled with explicit dosing instructions. The original medication container(s) must be sent along with your dog for emergency purposes.
- 4) Two safe toys in good condition may be sent along with your dog, if you desire.

### When can I drop off and pick up my dog?

**Weekday** pick up and drop off times are **anytime between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.** (\*Please give us estimated drop off and pick up times in advance.)

**Weekend** pick up and drop off times are **anytime between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.** (\*Please give us estimated drop off and pick up times in advance.)

**\*If dogs are dropped off at TailWaggers Doggy Daycare anytime before noon the day of their first overnight, a charge for a full day of daycare will be applied. If dogs are dropped off between noon and 3:00 p.m. the day of their first overnight, a charge for a half-day of daycare will be applied.**

### What should my dog leave at home?

- 1) Dog beds – dogs appreciate an old blanket or towel to remind them of home just as much. However, beds can be pre-approved. (TailWaggers Doggy DayCare provides comfy beds that are raised off of the floor and covered with fleece cushions and blanket.)
- 2) Tennis balls – we have LOTS and we won't run out!
- 3) Old broken bones or broken, unsafe toys. Please do not bring natural bones, latex toys, or toys that are easily chewed and swallowed. If your dog becomes bored or possessive he/she may eat the item. This could result in problems such as small pieces of bone that cause cuts and bleeding, blockage in the intestines, etc. Any toy or bone that your dog may not have while unattended, please leave at home!
- 4) Bowls from home – we have plenty!
